

STUDENT LIFE OFFICE (BVE)

What is the "BVE"?

BVE is the Student Life Office (Bureau De Vie Etudiante), a body within the University of Montpellier managed for and by students. It currently consists of the student vice president, a student life officer, and several elected student representatives. The BVE works closely with the various teams and departments of the University, as well as with student associations.

BVE missions

- Organize various events and activities
- Assist, advise, and support student associations and university tutoring programs
- Provide support for student projects and their funding requests (FSDIE Projects)
- Participate in committees that award social assistance (FSDIE Social)
- Take part in organizing student life venues (MDE student centers, (S) PACE)
- Organize campus activities in cooperation with the university's various departments
- Help create the university's Student Guide



BVE projects

 Food and hygienic product distribution on campus

In partnership with Linktree, the BVE offers distributions every other Monday at the Triolet and Richter student centers.

Welcome days for new students

Together with the university's cultural and institutional associations, departments, and partners, the BVE greets students at the Jardin des Plantes botanical garden every September at the start of the academic year.

Sports & Wellness Village

The BVE organizes the Sports & Wellness Village at the University Sports Center a few days after the welcome and orientation days. The program includes various sports activities such as bubble soccer, a fitness trail, tournaments, and more, as well as introductions to CPR, a smoothie bike, and many other activities.

 "Circular weeks" to raise awareness about ecological transition

Each year, the BVE partners with "Ile des Possibles" to offer various DIY workshops, resource centers, and conferences on the theme of ecological transition.

 Welcome evening for international students

The welcome evening for international students takes place every year in February to welcome new international students arriving in the second semester and help them integrate into University of Montpellier.

Tutor appreciation ceremonies

Every year in early June, the BVE celebrates the commitment of tutors from the University's associations and UEIs (Research and Training Units, Schools, and Institutes) at the Jardin des Plantes in downtown Montpellier.

 Association training sessions & coffee breaks

The BVE organizes training sessions for the University's student associations twice a year. These events inform associations about available resources and services and provide training on specific topics such as project management, sexual violence prevention, disability, etc.

The association coffee breaks are social evenings designed to encourage interaction between the university's

associations.

Arts and culture week

For an entire week, the BVE celebrates arts and culture through a varied program of events: writer's evenings, public speaking competitions, screenings, concerts, theater performances, and more. The event concludes with the Arts and Culture Village on the Triolet campus, where university associations and cultural groups offer workshops and concerts.

PhD coffee breaks

PhD student coffee breaks seek to combat social isolation among PhD students by offering them regular opportunities to get together in a friendly setting.

DEMOCRATIC PROCESSES

University of Montpellier operates democratically. The university's president is elected every four years by the university community. Student representatives actively participate in this democratic process by serving on the central councils (CA and CAc) and institution councils. They are elected by the student body every two years.

Administrative council (CA)

It comprises 36 members (24 elected), including 5 students. The council meets every month to determine the establishment's policy and budgets.

Academic Council (CAc)

It comprises 80 elected members, including 20 students. Its role is to ensure consistency between training and research policy. It is made up of two commissions:

- The Training and University Life Commission (CFVU) issues opinions on exam rules (assessment methods. teaching, study, and exam regulations, schedules), the allocation of resources for training, curricula, and student life (allocation of the CVEC student and campus life fee, in particular support for associations).
- The Research Commission (CR) issues opinions on research budgets, laboratory operating rules, and the allocation of funds.

Faculty Council

This is the faculty's deliberative body. It is made up of elected members and deals with issues relating to examination rules. teaching, research, and the budget.







INVOLVED STUDENTS!

In accordance with its "charter on the recognition of student involvement," UM acknowledges and values the skills of students who engage in civic activities.

What civic activities and/or commitments entitle you to take part in the student involvement program?

- Volunteer activities within a nonprofit organization (under France's law of 1901), professional activities, sports activities (see Article L 221-2 of the Sports Code), union activities (provided you hold a position of responsibility). Any activity as an elected representative on one of the establishment's councils, CNESER, CROUS, a local authority, or as a member of a student life office or student office (UFR, schools, institutes). Any civic activity recognized by the research and training unit (UFR), school, or institute.
- Commitments to the operational reserves of the national police or army, commitments as a volunteer firefighter, civic service, or volunteering in the armed forces.

How to get your involvement recognized?

STEP 1

Submitting an application

Submit your application for recognition (please check with your department and/or its website for the application schedule).

Any special study accommodations are subject to a separate application. Recognition is proposed and may be granted on a case-by-case basis.

STEP 2

Validation of student involvement

At the end of the year, you submit a report for evaluation. This report (typically a report or interview) is determined by the teaching team or included in your program's assessment methods.

Student involvement is recognized in assessment methods if it qualifies for a minimum of 2 ECTS credits; otherwise, it is recognized in a supplementary certificate. Tutoring/mentoring activities that entail a temporary contract are excluded from this option.

Are you having trouble with certain subjects? Don't panic, there's always a way to get help! Students at University of Montpellier make an effort to help their peers through a variety of tutoring programs.

What is tutoring?

Tutoring is a support system designed to help students succeed, providing them with support from their first to third years at UM. The volunteer tutors are enrolled in your program. They have specific training and are supervised by designated professors. Health tutoring, designed for PASS students pursuing degrees in health and medical fields, is the oldest program at UM.

How does it work?

Tutoring sessions are free of charge, and are held weekly in small groups. Tutoring gives you the opportunity to review the fundamental concepts you need to master. Tutoring is also available to help you with your documentary research in UM libraries!

Tutoring for students with disabilities

Specialized tutoring is also available to provide personalized support if you are a student with a disability.

WORKING **STUDENTS**

Do you have a job that requires you to work at least 10 hours per week on average? University of Montpellier takes your circumstances into account and helps you succeed in your studies while working.

Salaried employee status may be granted to any student enrolled at University of Montpellier in an initial training program preparing for a national degree (excluding work-study programs and general and advanced training in medical, pharmaceutical, and dental sciences).

You can benefit from salaried employee status if you have a work contract for at least:

- 10 hours per week on average, or 40 hours per month if the contract is for less than 12 consecutive weeks
- 120 hours per school semester or 240 hours during the academic year for a work contract lasting more than 12 consecutive weeks

All terms and conditions are formalized in the educational success contract to be signed with your department. This contract is established either for:

- the duration of the work contract:
- the academic year;
- or for one semester only.

The contract can be terminated by mutual agreement between the parties.

The application is first reviewed by the faculty, school, or institute where the student is enrolled.

Are you looking for a job?

UM recruits throughout the year (guidance, tutoring, support for library staff. etc.).

The Handiversité Department also recruits student workers. Your mission? To provide support for students with disabilities from September to June: note-taking, tutoring, educational support, assistance getting around campus, exam secretary duties, etc. More than 200 paid student contracts are offered each year.



INNOVATIVE **ENTREPRENEUR STUDENTS**

"Innovative Entrepreneur" status is a program that allows eligible students to benefit from adjustments to their studies and/or exams. This status may be granted to any student enrolled in a traditional or apprenticeship program leading to a national degree at University of Montpellier, following review by the "Innovative Student" committee.

To qualify, you must provide proof of:

- Enrollment in at least the third year of higher education (Bachelor's degree, BUT 3, engineering program, Master's degree, etc.);
- Your application reflecting a professional and entrepreneurial objective and presenting an innovative project related to one of the challenges of the University's "feed, care, protect" pillars.

Entrepreneurial projects may involve a personal entrepreneurial project, the promotion of intellectual property, or participation in a research and/or technology project.

In addition to making suitable accommodations for your studies, UM offers personalized support through entrepreneurial programs such as Initium, which provide specific support to earlystage entrepreneurs through mentoring, specialized training, and access to certain resources.

Clarification regarding national "Pépite" status:

The Innovative Entrepreneur status granted by UM complements and enhances the national student entrepreneur status offered by the "Pépite" program (student clusters for innovation, transfer, and entrepreneurship). However, this program does not automatically grant the student Innovative Entrepreneur status at University of Montpellier.

How to obtain Innovative **Entrepreneur status?**

Submit a request to your registrar's office. You will also need to submit a candidate application form. Candidates are asked to provide documents that demonstrate their connection to the entrepreneurial project.

STUDENTS WITH **DISABILITIES**

Nearly 1,900 students at UM are declared as having a disability. The University's **Central Preventive Medicine and Health Promotion Department (SCMPPS) and** the Handiversity Department work closely together to help all students succeed in their studies. They provide you with information, assess your situation, recommend appropriate accommodations, and follow up on their implementation.

SCMPPS missions:

- To welcome you, provide you with information, and support you medically with the help of a team of doctors certified by the Commission for the Rights and Autonomy of People with Disabilities (CDAPH), nurses, and psychologists.
- Assess your disability during a diagnostic visit in order to determine the appropriate accommodations for your studies, exams, and/or competitive examinations. Make an appointment with us at the earliest opportunity so we can evaluate your situation and set up the appropriate accommodations.

According to French law, "a disability is defined as any limitation of activity or restriction of participation in society experienced by a person in their environment due to a substantial, lasting, or permanent impairment of one or more physical, sensory, mental, cognitive, or psychological functions, a multiple disability, or a disabling health condition."

APPRENTICESHIP STUDENTS

In 2023-2024, more than 4,600 students chose to pursue apprenticeships via the EnSup-LR CFA (apprentice training center), an increase of nearly 300% over 10 years. The regional Sud de France Higher Education CFA offers more than 350 degree programs: BUT (technology Bachelor's degree), Bachelor's and vocational Bachelor's degrees, Master's degree, state diploma, engineering degree, etc.

Are you between 16 and 29 years old? By choosing apprenticeship training, you benefit from:

- A high-level degree program
- Dual status as a student and employee
- Dual supervision from an apprenticeship supervisor and academic advisor
- Monthly salary (from 43% to 100% of the minimumwageorminimummonthlywage)
- Valuable professional experience and skills that are directly applicable in the workplace

STUDENT ARTISTS **AND HIGH-LEVEL ATHLETES**

University of Montpellier strives to provide artists and high-level athletes with the resources they need to pursue their university studies. Status as a highlevel athlete or artist entitles students to special arrangements for their studies and/or exams.

To qualify for high-level athlete status, you must fulfill one of the following:

- Be registered on the French Ministry's
- Be part of the "Pôle France" program or have an agreement with a training center, or be a judge, referee, or elite sports coach;
- Meet specific criteria, which you can find on the SUAPS website.

The registration process is entirely online: you must submit your application and supporting documents on the SUAPS website. Complete applications will be reviewed by the University's highlevel sports commission. If your status is approved, study accommodations will then be determined by your department.

To qualify for artist status, you must be:

- Enrolled in an initial training program at one of UM's 17 establishments:
- Enrolled in a cultural or artistic institution such as a conservatory, art school, theater school, dance school, or other specialized establishment;
- Demonstrate intensive artistic activity through regular participation in events (concerts, exhibitions, festivals, performances, etc.).

This support, provided by the Art & Culture Department, is designed to help you acquire new skills and knowledge to professionalize your practice. You must apply online on the UM website or directly via the Art & Culture Department website. The details of your study arrangements will then be determined by your department.



Are you currently employed (salaried employee, job seeker, self-employed entrepreneur, freelancer, independent contractor, student on a professional training contract) and would like to pursue a university education? University of Montpellier's continuing education department is your main point of contact.

STUDENTS IN CONTINUING **EDUCATION**

Guidance in choosing the best training program

The continuing education department will guide you toward the degree and training program best suited to your current situation and career plans. National degrees, university degrees, vocational qualifications, adult education diplomas (DAEU), short programs, etc. More than 650 courses are available through continuing education, work-study programs, and validation of prior learning.

Helping you with financing and contracts

The continuing education department at the University of Montpellier will help you benefit from financing options such as OPCO, personal training accounts, individual quotes, etc., and will prepare the necessary documents for your training program.

Are you a work-study student on a professional training contract or undergoing professional reorientation? Applications and contracts with companies are managed directly by the continuing education department teams.

PHD STUDENTS

Would you like to pursue a career in research? PhD degrees are researchbased programs lasting between three and six years. They are the highest degree in higher education and provide professional research experience aimed at producing new knowledge.

Enrolling in a PhD program?

A PhD is a postgraduate degree that can be pursued after obtaining a Master's degree or equivalent. With a thesis topic in mind, PhD students conduct their research under the supervision of a thesis director within a research unit. A doctoral project represents an original and unique research topic, with each student developing their own professional objectives.

Research work is presented in a thesis document and defended before a jury, which is then responsible for awarding the PhD degree.

PhD programs typically last three years with dedicated funding to complete the degree. Programs can last up to six years if research is conducted on a part-time basis. While preparing the thesis, complementary activities such as teaching, mediation, and the dissemination of scientific information are offered.

Doctoral schools and colleges

Doctoral training within a higher education establishment is provided by a doctoral school, which offers personalized supervision to doctoral students.

Additionally, University of Montpellier has established a doctoral college that offers training to develop the crossdisciplinary skills of future PhD graduates, leads initiatives to promote professional placement, and promotes PhD programs and careers for PhD graduates.



WHAT ABOUT **DIGITAL? RESOURCES AND GOOD PRACTICES**

UM provides students with a wide range of digital resources and services to support them throughout their studies. These services are generally accessible from the digital work environment (ENT).

TO YOUR HEALTH!

The mission of the healthcare professionals at the Central Preventive Medicine and Health Promotion Service (SCMPPS) is to welcome you, listen to you, and accompany you free of charge and in complete confidentiality.

Because feeling good and being in good health is a real factor in success. SCMPPS offers you:

- Preventive visits with a nurse or doctor:
- Discussing your overall health (physical, mental, social, etc.). Vaccination status, issuing medical certificates, etc. By appointment.
- Specialized appointments: psychology, tobacco addiction treatment, nutrition, gynecology.
- Prevention initiatives ("À l'UM ta santé" - your health at UM) and screening campaigns run by professionals and student health representatives (ERS).
- You'll find a "Prév-Box" near your preventive medicine center, which gives you access to sanitary products, condoms, and breathalyzers at any time.

UNIVERSITY HEALTH CENTER

The Montpellier University Health Center (CSU, Centre de Soins) offers healthcare services and treatment plans tailored to the needs of students in Montpellier.

The University Health Center is an inter-establishment program that allows you to:

- Make appointments for general medical consultations, gynecology, psychiatry, physical therapy, and psychological support.
- Benefit from 100% coverage (no upfront costs upon presentation of your student card, health insurance card, and complementary health insurance certificate).
- Get help with administrative procedures related to your health, such as entitlement to benefits, complementary health insurance, etc..

A general practitioner at the center also performs medical abortions.

The University Health Center can also be considered as your primary care physician for the duration of your studies.

REMINDER:

The university health center practices full third-party payment.

To benefit from this service, you must present:

- Your student card (or certificate of enrollment)
- Your French "Vitale" health insurance card or, depending on your situation, your provisional Ameli certificate
- Proof of French supplementary health insurance

If you cannot present a Vitale card and/ or your mutual insurance certificate, you can still choose to pay for your visit.




Temporary emergency assistance

The Montpellier-Occitanie CROUS service covers the five administrative departments of the Montpellier Academic district. It is mainly present in three major cities: Montpellier, Nîmes, and Perpignan.

Its missions revolve around five main priorities:

- Financial aid: scholarships based on social criteria, specific emergency aid, mobility assistance, etc.
- Social support: a network of social service assistants available to listen to you at your place of study
- Housing: 10,300 affordable rooms and studios, as well as a private rental listing portal: locaviz.fr
- Restaurant services: six university restaurants and 21 cafeterias Cost: 1€ for scholarship recipients / 3.30€ for non-scholarship recipients for meals at our cafeterias and university restaurants (called "Resto'U"). Affordable prices thanks to the student's Izly account.
- Culture and campus life: Yoot program, funding for student projects, spaces dedicated to student creations, artistic workshops and competitions, etc.

Fighting against LGBT+phobia

48% of those in the LGBT+ community in France aged between 18 and 24 have been victims of harassment within the last five years. To combat discrimination based on sexual orientation and gender identity, UM organizes an annual week dedicated to fighting LGBT+phobia and participates in the Montpellier Pride march. UM was also the first university in France to sign the "L'Autre Cercle" LGBT charter.

Discrimination can take many forms. It can be linked to gender identity, origin, appearance, religion, or sexual orientation. Perpetrators are punishable by disciplinary and legal action. Whether you are a witness or a victim, UM's teams are here to support you in complete confidentiality.

What is the purpose of filing a report?


